Re: AMBULANCE PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM 2022-25

We write in response to the correspondence received from Ambulance Victoria (AV) on 26 July 2021 concerning the progress of the Ambulance Performance Improvement Program (APIP) and more specifically the proposal for a Medium Acuity Transport Service (MATS).

As verbally indicated in the meeting on 23 July 2021, Ambulance Employees Australia Victoria (AEAV) supports in principle the proposal to add additional resources to Ambulance Victoria's response capability. We do however have significant concerns regarding the seemingly rushed implementation. This is evidenced by the very short time frame for union feedback of 2 days.

AEAV believes there are a number of issues that require further clarification before a considered response could be provided. The current level of detail raises a number of areas of concern. These concerns include but are not limited to:

- Potential for crews to be sent to higher acuity cases
- Potential for burnout of paramedics as a result of working consistently with GAP's for up to 12 months
- Access to Paramedic Educators, particularly in rural centres
- Clinical Instructor requirement for paramedics working with GAP's
- Additional workload for Fleet Services
- Additional workload for Team Managers
- Remuneration for GAP's recruited under this proposal.

In lieu of further negotiations and sufficient detail, the AEAV provides in principle support to the concept only but is unwilling to provide unmitigated support for the trial as presented.
