Background

The department of Health (the department) issues Non-Emergency Patient Transport (NEPT) licences to private providers to undertake NEPT services. As a condition of this licencing, NEPT licence holders are required to adhere to Clinical Practice Protocols (CPPs) provided by the department. The department is undertaking a review of the CPPs with a view to update this document to ensure that:

- · Best-practice treatment pathways are recommended
- New protocols are added, where appropriate, to assist NEPT workforce to manage conditions reasonably expected during NEPT service delivery
- · Prescribe minimum standards of equipment
- Update recent legislative changes
